### UUSJ Advances the Social Justice Work of UU Congregations and Organizations

- ❖ UUSJ sends a monthly e-newsletter to more than 500 people to publicize UU and other area social justice events, programs, and opportunities to witness and advocate for UU social justice concerns.
- ❖ UUSJ honors and celebrates UU social justice activists at the annual UUSJ Awards Benefit Gala that supports UUSJ Social Justice Fund grants up to \$500.
- ❖ UUSJ coordinates advocacy and witness opportunities and educates people on priority issues, showcase model programs and best practices.

### UUSJ Increases the Frequency, Impact and Visibility of UU Collaborative Efforts

UUSJ helped increase the impact made by area congregations by moving their concerns for immigrants into “action for justice and advocacy.” With a two-year grant from the UU Association, UUSJ worked to “inspire, engage and equip” congregations to work on immigration issues.

One example is that UUSJ supported a “Document Day Workshop” to help more than 75 immigrant families prepare for emergencies. Participants learned what essential documents they need to direct their families if they are jailed, deported, or hospitalized and how to prepare required legal paperwork once Immigration Reform is passed.

UUSJ amplifies UU voices by joining with issue-based and interfaith groups such as:

- ❖ **Environmental Issues** – Greater Washington Interfaith Power and Light; Chesapeake Climate Action Network and Interfaith Moral Action on Climate;
- ❖ **Immigration Issues** – Casa de Maryland and Virginia Coalition of Latino Organizations;
- ❖ **LGBTQ Rights Issues** – Equality MD and Equality VA; and,
- ❖ **Economic Justice Issues** with Move to Amend and Common Cause.

UUSJ ramped up efforts in 2013 to advocate and bear witness for our UU values and give voice to our UU principles on Capitol Hill.
